The following are materials needed for second grade:

- durable school bag and lunch box
- three sharpened pencils (needed each day) If a sharpener is brought to school, it must have a cover on it to collect shavings.)
- pink, rectangular eraser
- 4 glue sticks (These are used frequently and will need to be replaced often.)
- small pair of scissors (Fiskars are best)
- one 24 pack of crayons (you might want to get another to save at home to replenish)
- one 8 pack of washable markers
- 1 extra large stretchable book cover for our reader
- **4 folders:** Your child will need a blue folder for class work, a red folder for papers sent home each day, a yellow folder for tests, and a folder of your choice for Spanish. Be sure to label the folders clearly with your child's name. Please note that your child will use these folders all year and plastic folders are more durable and do last.
- ***Copybooks and a pencil case will be purchased for your child and you will be asked to cover this cost at the beginning of the school year.**
- 2 boxes of tissues, 2 rolls of paper towels, and 2 containers of Clorox wipes.
- a package of dry erase markers and an eraser (We will supply the dry erase board.)

Some helpful hints:

- Please use a permanent marker to label **everything** with your child's name.
- Please bring all school supplies on the first day. The cleaning supplies can be sent in the first week. Thank you for getting these supplies for our classroom.
- Please send in your child's book report the first week of school.
- Thank you for helping your child to be prepared for second grade. We look forward to a special year in second grade!

The best way to help prepare your child for second grade is by having him/her read every day. Allowing them to choose the books will inspire them to read more. Don't become concerned over reading levels. In elementary school, each child is developing at his/her own pace. The more they read, the more reading skills will improve. Children who don't read during the summer lose up to one month of their instruction, while children who do read come back to school ready to learn!

We ask that your child choose **ONE** of the books read and complete the Book Report paper that is on the back of this paper. Please bring it to school during the first week of school in September.
