Welcome to the fourth grade summer reading experience!

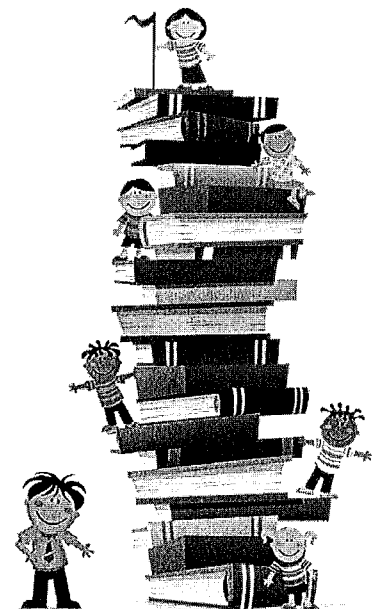
We hope you love these books as much as we do. Listed below are the current fourth graders' favorite books from this past school year. We hope you enjoy the books that you read over the summer.
